H. OLD BUSINESS/NEW BUSINESS: Ms. O'Connor and Mr. Silkensen presented information as follows:

• Do the Math Intervention Program by Marilyn Burns Update

- Brooklake completed the first 5 day cycle of the Math BSI program. The teachers' feedback was positive about the program.
- Easy to use and follow along.
- Manipulatives are utilized with each lesson, which helped the students understand the concepts.
- We will continue to monitor the students growth in the program
- We will conduct a second training with a Do the Math trainer for the first week in May.

• STEAM Update

- o Jason Erdreich, the President of the New Jersey Technology and Engineering Education Association(NJTEEA), worked with our RMS Stem Lab teachers on utilizing alternative energy sources into our 8th Grade STEM Lab curriculum.
- He praised the Florham Park District for the logical progression of coding languages to our K-8 students. With the new progression, we will be able to utilize the programming language Python.

• ELA Update

- LLI services are being extended to Kindergarten to help assist students who are struggling to read at a level C. This is a team effort that involves the reading intervention and Special Ed teachers at Briarwood school who are working together to service these students. We have seen tremendous gains in the reading growth for students with IEPs and believe the additional LLI support in the morning is a large factor in this growth.
- Grades 3-8 are engaged in their test prep units which are a review of the units and standards covered this year. A letter will be sent out by Dr. Varley describing the curriculum during testing.
- Following the NJSLA, FPKS will continue with our curriculum and engage in curriculum that is designed to support learning and tap into the fun of the end of the year with units such as writing comics, reading fantasy, learning about historical fiction, and engaging in content area literacy.
