### **E. WORK SESSION UPDATES**

- <u>2018-2019 DISTRICT/SUPERINTENDENT GOALS ACTION PLAN</u> Dr. Varley reviewed the plan(s).
- February 14, 2019 In-service Day Mr. Silkensen and Ms. O'Connor presented;
  - o 26 different topics of professional development were offered to district staff
  - Our leadership cohort is a multi-year professional development program that supports teacher leadership. Teachers learn about adult development, teaming, and choose their own leadership role to assume based on a topic they find to be meaningful to them. Participants selected topics of interest to them, attended professional development, worked with Christy and Brian, and read professional texts to present the following topics of professional development to our staff:

    - Romina Viola: Supporting Students with Reading Writing Workshop
    - **Donna Kuzemczak & Ro Franklin**: "Patterns of Power" Instead of Grammar "rules"
    - Cindy Regan & Kathleen Cogan: Interactive Read Aloud to support Literacy Acquisition with Social-Emotional Education and a Responsive Classroom
    - Michaela Harris & Karen Stein: Setting up Research Groups, Modeling Research Charts, Selecting Nonfiction Text, & Planning for a Research Group
  - Onis Sheeran met with the math teachers. The last two trainings revolved around breaking down the LinkIt! Data. During the in-service, teachers were provided time with Denis to create small group instruction action plans. We also provided time for the math teachers to work with the math intervention teachers.

# • Do the Math Intervention Program by Marilyn Burns

- We would like to pilot Do the Math by Marilyn Burns this year at Brooklake Elementary School.
- Math intervention aims to provide more time for students to develop understanding, reason, reflect, and practice critical math content. Do The Math is a research-based intervention program that gives students the chance to keep up or catch up with grade-level content. The program focuses on rebuilding the four core topic areas (Addition & Subtraction, Multiplication, Division, and Fractions that support students' successful transition from elementary to middle and high school.
- Do the Math is similar to the LLI program as it is a module based program. The instruction is consistent with Math in Focus instruction.
