D. SUNSHINE STATEMENT:

In accordance with the Open Public Meetings Act, (Chapter 231, P.L. 1975), adequate notification of this meeting has been provided by advertising in the <u>Morristown Daily Record</u> and the <u>Madison-Florham Park Eagle</u>. In addition, notices were posted at the Municipal Clerk's Office, Public Library, and the Board Administration Office at 67-71 Ridgedale Ave at least 48 hours prior to the meeting.

E. <u>WORK SESSION UPDATES:</u> Ms.O'Connor presented information on the following:

1. Inservice recap

On Thursday, February 13th all district teaching personnel and staff assistants came together for professional development. The district provided sessions on Shared Reading, Math in grades 4-8, ELA Planning and Test Preparation, Specials teachers curriculum review, and training for staff assistants to meet the differentiated needs of the teachers across the district. A highlight of the day was recognition and lunch provided by Heineimann and Ed Kennedy who generously donated lunch to thank the district for their leadership with literacy and the fact that so many districts across the state come to Florham Park to learn about the implementation of Leveled Literacy Intervention, Reading Workshop, and Writing Workshop. He attributed the districts' success with these programs to the ongoing professional development that is provided to the teachers and the administrative teams' commitment to this professional development with resources and their own attendance in sessions.

2. Visits from neighboring districts

The LLI teachers in Brooklake and Briarwood received a district from Madison Public School District to observe the intervention system. The Ridgedale ELA teachers were visited by TC staff developer and author Emily Strange-Campbell and Mountainside School District to review the implementation of reading and writing workshop and content area literacy.

- 3. Approval of revised science curriculum The science curriculum has been revised to include adjustments required for QSAC.
- 4. Approval of curriculum for students in special class settings. Board approval is requested for a new internal document that outlines the resources and data of how students in LLD and MD classrooms are supported.

All agenda and non agenda items are allowed) Councilman Zuckerman commented on the rise of social emotional issues and dealing with behavioral issues in schools.
