Hosting a summer sessions for at-risk ELA & Math students and ESY services for eligible students with disabilities.
District counselors, service providers, CST members, parent trainings, the SEL curriculum, contracting with CarePlus, NextMark-Mental Health, & ProjectPride, & working with the Traumatic Loss Coalition of Morris County, the district will provide intervention services to students & staff to address SEL, mental health & other needs that may arise.

The district provided the opportunity for public comment at the open public curriculum work session that took place on June 21, 2021. The Safe Reopening Plan 2021/22 was discussed as an agenda item and then the Florham Park BOE approved a resolution approving the Safe Reopening Plan 2021/22. No changes to the originally approved plan have been made at this time.

Sanitizer will continue to be made available to all individuals and permitted to be carried by an individual for personal use.

4) Cleaning and maintaining healthy facilities, including improving ventilation ([count] of 1000 maximum characters used)

The District plan for cleaning & maintaining healthy facilities, including improving ventilation is to continue with the established procedures & schedules for cleaning/sanitizing district facilities and school buses. Additional overtime has been added to specific custodians, if needed, to increase the cleaning & sanitizing protocols. Interior classroom doors & exterior windows with safety screens will remain open, fans have been provided to rooms without HVAC, all HVAC units have been inspected & continue to be cleaned and maintained, along with scheduled filter replacements throughout the year. Custodians will continue to use approved disinfectants regularly on high touch point surfaces to clean the facilities & school buses. 6' tables were purchased for all schools to accommodate a potential 6' distancing requirement for lunches.

5) Contact tracing in combination with isolation and quarantine, in collaboration with the State, local, territorial, or Tribal health departments ([count] of 1000 maximum characters used)

The district's plan for contact tracing will be reflected by the current guidance demonstrated by the Governor's Executive Orders, in consultation with the local health department.
